







Workshop held with mapping exercise to collect input on the corridor

From 178 mapped comments and an additional 35 comments collected, the County and the project team got a good idea of what the community values along the FM 150 Corridor. Below is a summary of the received comments, and the full meeting report is posted on the project website.





CITIZENS ADVISORY PANEL

A Citizens Advisory Panel (CAP) of 11 local stakeholders has been working alongside the County and project team to help define the project and public process. The CAP has met 10 times and shared valuable input for the project.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why is the County studying FM 150?

FM 150 was identified in the Hays County Transportation Plan as a roadway that would at some point in the future need upgrades to handle the equivalent of 4 lanes of traffic due to growth projections. The County is developing a plan NOW for how to incrementally improve the roadway over time, allowing proactive, rather than reactive decisions to be made.

What are growth projections and where will growth occur?

The Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization, or CAMPO, predicts that the population of Hays County will nearly quadruple over the next 25 years. Much of the growth is expected to occur near cities along 135, but the entire county will see a large population increase as employment, education, and recreation opportunities continue to develop. The roadway system will have to expand to accommodate traffic associated with growth.

Will FM 150 look like Highway 290?

The whole point of this process is to avoid a road that looks like 290! Hays County is engaging stakeholders in a comprehensive way well in advance of traditional roadway design projects. In addition, the context sensitive approach being used does not force fit a typical highway section to the corridor. Rather, it considers customized corridor concepts to match project needs.

What will the road look like?

That is the question this process will answer and we will not know until the process is complete. The road may not look the same in different communities as it is adapted to the different contexts along the corridor. The County is collecting technical information and community input. By putting these two together, a context sensitive plan for how the road could be modified will be developed in conjunction with extensive community input and discussions.

Will the road be 4 lanes and why do you need 150 feet of right-of-way?

This process and the resulting plan for moving forward assumes that FM 150 will eventually carry the equivalent of 4 lanes of traffic. The way 4 lanes actually lays out can vary. Some concepts include expanding the existing alignment while some include providing 2 lanes in a new alignment. The project team will continue working with community members on preferences in different areas such as incorporating a parkway feel with an emphasis on landscaping that requires more right-of-way or supporting a simpler layout with two lanes in each direction all on one section of pavement. Various options would require different amounts of right-of-way, as some would need more or less than 150 feet.

Is it too late to give my input?

No! This is the beginning phase for developing a plan for FM 150. Hays County and the project team will continue to work closely with the community throughout the Character Plan and beyond.







We appreciate the hard work and resources that have gone in to the Phase I process so far. It is important to be ahead of the growth curve. And we appreciate that our community has the opportunity to weigh in on solutions for current and future transportation needs in the Driftwood area.

We feel however, that much more time and thoughtful consideration needs to be given to any proposals concerning north FM 150/Elder Hill Rd/1826 before solutions, if any are needed, can be included in Phase I of this process.

Driftwood's character is one of a spread out, rural ranching community whose residents live there because of its tranquility and abundance of scenic beauty. Its development has slowly and organically unfolded in harmony with its character. Those qualities lie at the heart of its value.

It is not a Dripping Springs which sits at the intersection of two major roadways, nor a Wimberley whose center is much more densely developed. It is not an area where 2500 rooftops, one to a fifth of an acre lot, are on the drawing board. That is not who we are.

So, in our view, any talk at this point of 4 lane roadways and highway extensions running right through the heart of the area are extremely premature and have not been examined closely enough to include any kind of solutions in Phase I. There are many many improvements that could be rolled out that would make use of existing roadways to handle future transportation needs in the western part of Hays County. Other parts of the county, the eastern part especially, are in much more dire need for dramatic solutions than 150/Elder Hill/1826.

In short, the necessity for severely diminishing Driftwood's unique natural beauty and scenic value to make an easier commute in to Austin for people further west has not been even close to proven up in our estimation.

We respectfully request that more time be given to the Phase I process if any changes or extensions to 150/Elder Hill Rd/1826 extension are to be included in it.

My name is Jim Reiss and I own property at Driftwood, TX 78619. We are new to the area, having made an initial investment in our property in La Ventana, with plans to make other land acquisitions in the immediate area. I offer the following feedback to what I have seen thus far:

- 1. The plans, as I saw them represented, seem very well conceived given their supposed early stage. The plans where 150 are concerned seem very straight-forward.
- 2. You are facing an ENORMOUS amount of resistance based on the way the open forum was handled at the Mansion at the recent meeting. Whatever your perception of the resistance, its probably 3-4x that. People are aligning and mounting to fight this prima facia even though obviously the plan, at least part of it, has real merit. To that end I think its important the Commissioners get out in the area and break the affected population down into meetings where people can be heard. The notion that people have to email and write has a wholesale dismissive about it that is going to wind up having various people lawyer-up, and that costs me as a Hays County taxpayer more money. If the taxpayers have to fund the County to fight our own landowners for this to happen, people are going to revolt against County government on more levels than just the FM150 plan.
- 3. The County needs to bring something other than a road expansion project to the Driftwood Community. If you want people to support this, put something on the table...an investment in enhancing Driftwood for the County. We don't consider a more efficient flow intriguing an enhancement: Better roads through here help those passing through, but doesn't immediately help those who are already able to get everything they need and want from the existing highway infrastructure. Whether it be a park or recreation area, or some other County funded investment, we want to see Hays County leverage Driftwood for the benefits of its citizens. As it stands, it looks like you are just trying to grow the highway system to help people more quickly get between Wimberley, Austin and Dripping Springs.
- 4. To the point regarding the portion of the plan that might affect expansion or bypassing of Elder Hill Road, this looks like an absolute waste of Hays County taxpayer money to me. I have not seen the traffic counts but I have driven these roads daily for nearly 6 months as we have scouted out property and more recently having traveled the roads living here. If the county really has the fiscal ability to fund development of either a bypass or improvement of Elder Hill, then either the county is overtaxing its citizens that it would have such surplus funding or the county is reaching to find speculative projects by with which to drive a future bond proposition. Or maybe both We have not lived here long but I could easily provide you with a list of places that money would be better spent to improve the road conditions in the county.

We have lived in the DFW and Houston suburbs since 1996 and have seen enormous suburban growth, including a number of similar highway expansion projects. Again, while the current draft FM150 plan does have some merit, it appears to be highly speculative to me when I compare the gravity of the construction to the rural state of the area. I do recognize that growth is coming to the area. Having lived in markets where the highway system did not keep up with the population growth I for one am not a big fan of highway congestion, especially given that we have to drive into Austin every day to work. But this highway proposal seems to overreach that growth by many years.

Some modest modifications to FM 150 and some even minor modifications to Elder Hill Road are a far better investment proposal for the taxpayers and landowners than what I've seen in the FM150 character development plan. To that end we do not support the plan as structured. Again, a more tactical level of face to face planning between the County and the affected citizens will be needed to gain support.

You have done an excellent job of putting the materials and presentation together. I understand the concern over future growth in Hays County and the impact future growth would have on the roadways.

As we all recognize, people move to the Texas Hill Country for many reasons. The top three in my mind, for the nature and beauty, job, or get away from city congestion and way of life.

I moved to Hays County for the beauty, nature and get away for city congestion. I love the country roads and also that they have curves.

Here is my input for handling future growth and FM150 and 1826:

- 1. Place a 25 year moratorium on building future housing developments. This would definitely limit the number of people able to live in Hays County. Now certain areas could have this limit while towns such as Buda, Kyle and San Marcos could grow up but not out. this would negate the need to expand FR 150 to four lanes.
- 2. I see the need to keep the current roads operational during moderate rains/semi-high water over the low water crossings. For example, the low water crossing on 170 just east of RR 12 could have small bridge to raise the road level. This would allow for the water to pass under the road during moderate rains. Access to the 2 low water crossings on FM150, do need to be preserved. I love this part of the road where it gets hilly (reminds me of mountainous roads in Colorado) and I would like for the road to still be in the steeper part of the hills. I remember the concept of moving the road slightly to northeast (?) that might be an option to keep the road operational during moderate rains. But being able to get to the creek is very important. People like to explore or sit with their feet in the water. It adds value to peoples' lives.
- 3. I am against widening any part of FR150 to four lanes. I do see where some of the shoulders could be widened for safety. I would not be opposed to adding a left hand turn lane at 1826 and 150 for south bound traffic. And there is one other road between 1826 and Dripping Springs that could use a left hand turn lane. I do not know the name of it. This would make the current roadway safer.
- 4. Elder Hill Road By Pass- Because private land would have to be acquired and therefore, split someones current land into, I am opposed to this. People buy the land for a reason and having a public road constructed through it is not one of those reasons. Why would a land owner want to deal with traffic on both sides of their land? If this does in fact end up happening, I am opposed to hooking it into Elder Hill Road. The part of Elder Hill Road that is my most favorite is just east of RR12 up to the first housing development on the right and before it goes up the hill. The tree canopy on this section is magnificent. I use Elder Hill Road going to and from work every day. It starts my day off well and ends it well. It brings peace to my life.
- 5. Driftwood- Yes, I agree it needs to be preserved. In my opinion the only thing that will truly slow traffic down would be speed bumps. I am not in favor of speed bumps. A left turn lane onto Elder Hill Road would make it safer. I am opposed to a round-about and any traffic signals. I do like the idea of signage, be it overhead arch or Welcome to Driftwood monument signage, would be nice. A way of setting the tone for the type of community Driftwood is and what is represents.

I do think there is a perception of 'railroading' the citizens of Hays County into your Concepts and that this is going to happen with or without the citizens approval. I liken it to "Let's just wear them down little by

little. Let's spoon feed them." Most of us are too intelligent for that and can see through your current approach.

Thank you, Commissioners Conley and Whisenant, for taking time to meet with the community about this project. I am pleased that options being considered ruled out making FM 150 4 lanes all the way through beautiful Driftwood. I don't think sidewalks in the community's center (area near FM 150 at Elder Hill RD) would be in keeping with the character of Driftwood. It is the center of the community, but its character is rural; sidewalks would not be appropriate. Large shoulders on the road in this area also would be inappropriate and would ruin the beauty and rural character that is the essence of Driftwood. We must protect this area, please!

Traffic to the schools that will be built in the future should be directed onto the roads where the schools will be located rather than increasing traffic capacity (meaning more and larger roads) on other roads not near the schools. Peak school-related traffic will be very near the school locations, not the surrounding areas.

The phase 1 process should not be rushed, and we need more time to look at and create other options for FM 150 North and Elder Hill Road.





We are the owners of Dog Camp Pet Boarding and Grooming. We are located at ______, Driftwood. We began our business 15 years ago and pride ourselves in offering a safe, peaceful environment for our clients' pets – which can be up to 80-85 dogs! Our property (16.42 acres) runs on the northeast side of 150 between Hays County Recycle/Darden Hill and Onion Creek.

A survey plat was done in June 2000 before we began construction of Dog Camp. We used this survey along with the Hundred Year Flood Plane to help us in the placement of our buildings. Since 2000 flooding at the Onion Creek Bridge over 150 has occurred several times – twice this year (May and October). Since our buildings are located on an elevated area of our property above Onion Creek, the recent rise in water levels and flooding were well below where our buildings (and dogs) are located. However, we have concerns that proposed expansion of 150 may impact Onion Creek as it could redirect water flow towards these buildings should 150 be elevated above where it is today.

We're glad that one goal of this project is to "avoid a road that looks like 290"!!! Couldn't agree more! An emphasis on landscaping that will integrate with the natural beauty of the properties and trees along 150 would be appreciated and would be a benefit for our business, too. Preservation of trees and historial sites need to be protected as this is what makes the Hill Country area so unique and appealing!



My comments specifically address the section of FM 150 from the intersection of 1826 to the intersection of Darden Hill.

It seems to me this section needs more study. The three slides from the presentation (attached) are confusing—in one, this section is called a community zone, in another a transition zone, and in the third, rural highway character. I would think the number of businesses and long-time residents would qualify it for a community zone (in which the speed limits are lower than in the rural highway zone). Maybe I don't understand, but I do think it could be more clearly defined.


In particular, I want to point out issues with the sharp curve a mile north of the 1826 intersection. My property fronts this curve, with my driveway exiting out onto the section where there's minimal visibility in either direction. This is a dangerous curve, I admit. I've lived here 18 years, and some of my neighbors have lived here their entire lives. We've discussed the need for more safety on this curve, however, some of the options that have been proposed seem too disruptive and very expensive. The curve is where it is because it goes around a hill. If you look on the satellite view, there are at least 7 homes on this hill on the southwest side of 150—to straighten the curve would require the county to purchase some parts or all of the properties, including some of the homes. Additionally, there are a number of businesses that would need compensation. That's a lot of money. And it would require expensive excavation to cut through or go over the hill. It would pretty much destroy the rural character of this stretch. I submit that there are other, less expensive options that should be looked at before taking such drastic action. Wider shoulders and the addition of turn lanes would be a step in the right direction. So would lowering the speed limit—a lot of accidents have occurred on this curve due to speeding.

Recent flooding in this area should draw attention to the runoff issues we already have, and adding more impervious cover in the form of roads and housing developments could create more flooding and damages, costing homeowners, the county and the state.


I realize growth will happen—when my husband and I moved here in 1997, there were no lights across the valley, and now there are dozens. But if we can find a way to manage growth so we can sustain the people who live here and not ruin the character of the area, wouldn't that be in everyone's interest? The Onion Creek Valley has a long history—some of my neighbors are the descendants of the first settlers to this area, and have planned to leave their land to their children. The beauty and serenity of our community should be preserved for future generations.



Comments Regarding Planned FM150 Improvements

I was in attendance at the Public Meeting #3 for the Hays County FM150 West Character Plan. I am a resident of Hays County in the area being impacted by this proposed plan and am sending this email to provide my comments.

- 1) I believe that the purported need to expand the capacity or throughput of traffic through FM 150 to meet future expected growth, is inaccurate.
 - a. In fact, I believe that it is actually a self-fulfilling prophecy, where, if you build it, they will come. Rather than being built to meet expected growth needs, I believe that this is intended to drive growth in the areas around FM150.
 - b. The existing major roads (FM1826, RR12, FM967, HWY290, and IH35) currently are and should continue to be the major transit routes through this section of the county. The expansion of FM150 between RR12 and Darden Hill road is likely needed to address the known increase in traffic that will occur with the new Elementary/Middle School being built on Sawyer Ranch Road and the future High School on Darden Hill road.
 - i. It seems that expansion of Darden Hill road and Sawyer Ranch road, as well as better development of the Darden Hill road intersections at FM1826 and FM150 are needed.
 - ii. As much of the area past Driftwood is not zoned for DSISD, it does not follow that traffic from that area would significantly impacted by those schools being built and not necessitating significant changes to FM150 in that area
- 2) FM150 has immense historical, cultural and aesthetic value to the people of Hays County. The curves, hills, and picturesque areas around the low water crossings epitomize the character of the Texas Hill Country.
 - a. If the premise is accepted that FM150 will the route to handle a significant amount of traffic resulting from future growth, then it is also true that episodic interruption of traffic on that roadway or closure of that road way would be unacceptable to the users of that roadway.
 - i. Because of the low water crossings on FM150, other traffic routes currently have to be available and used in the event of heavy rains and flashfloods.
 - ii. If FM150 is developed to handle this future use along its current path, there would be no options but to address the low water crossings with elevated bridges.
 - 1. Doing so would destroy the Hill Country character of those areas
 - 2. Doing so would disrupt the natural flow of Onion Creek and have a significantly negative effect on the ecosystems in those areas.
 - 3. Doing so would significantly affect the local property owners in those areas
 - b. Many of the businesses and communities within the current FM150 corridor depend upon the current character of the roadway and the intrinsic Hill Country escape that it provides. Significantly changing the roadway and it's character would be damaging to those interests.
- 3) The proposed bypass route from FM1826 to Elder Hill Road continuing to RR12 really makes no sense.
 - i. It does not address any traffic flow problems that would not already be addressed by the improvements to FM150 between RR12 and FM1826
 - ii. It would result in significant disruption to property owners in the area, and change the long established character of the community.
- 4) Of the existing plans proposed, I believe that the only feasible option is the bypass route from FM967 to the existing alignment of FM150.
 - a. FM1826 and FM967 are already well established roadways that are undergoing rework, or would easily be able to handle additional rework to increase capacity
 - i. They connect with areas that are already developing higher population densities. Tapping into FM967 would be an efficient continuation of established traffic flow.

- ii. This route avoids the issues along Onion Cree (low water crossings, and environmental)
- iii. This route allows FM150 to remain relatively the same along the majority of its path thus maintaining its historical, environmental and cultural place in the community and also allow it to provide the Hill Country character to residents and visitors in this part of Hays County.

Regarding concept numbers 1, 2, 3 and 8 of the FM150 Character Plan:

I travel to Dripping Springs from Goldenwood West 3 times per week. The route includes RM1826 from Crystal Hill to FM150, FM150 from RM1826 to Driftwood Post Office, and FM150 from Driftwood to RM12. Over the past 16 years I have witnessed at least 10-fold increase in road traffic, especially on RM1826. Traffic is always much heavier on RM1826. My family and I have experienced significant injuries and property losses due to the poor road conditions and obsolete roadway construction.

At minimum all these roadways must have shoulders to help drivers evade surprise traffic changes including deer, bicyclists, accident blockages and distracted oncoming drivers. Also, pull outs should accommodate law enforcement for speeding drivers. In addition, pavement drop offs along the road sides are too steep; they are extremely dangerous and should be immediately brought to code conformance. All low water crossings should also be raised.

We should first improve the safety of our existing roads, before launching off into grand new road projects. Furthermore, RM1826 improvements should be addressed before widening FM150.

I was unaware of how far along these ideas had been planned until I attended the meeting at Thurman's Mansion on October 22. I found out about the meeting because I happened to see a sign next to the road by the Driftwood Post Office earlier that day; not well publicized. It seemed very suspicious that the meeting was scheduled for the same date and time as the Dripping Springs City Council Open House (which I had originally planned to attend). I am glad I chose to attend the meeting and find out what is being attempted / proposed.

I would like to register my objections to the plan presented as it is unnecessary at this time.

While parts of Hays County are experiencing tremendous growth and expect to continue this trend, our part of the county (that in the "character plan") is not in the highest growth area. I feel the expressed expected development in the near future is overstated.

In this era of tightening budgets and rampant conservatism, we should be applying the funds available for improvements to the most rapidly growing areas of the county. Areas along the I-35 corridor such as Kyle and Buda, as well as the California-style sprawl of Caliterra in Dripping Springs are much busier and in need of more attention.

Just as one example, Ranch Road 12 south of Dripping Springs needs a lot more attention / improvement for the hundreds more vehicles that are being added to the roads due to Caliterra. It will soon be a very real, ugly congestion problem.

In fact, I believe this plan would do more to encourage rampant unchecked growth and development along FM 150, rather than to "preserve it's character."

There is also the matter of obtaining lands by means of "eminent domain" or otherwise to pursue such projects as the connector from FM 1826 at 150 over to the intersection of Elder Hill Road and RR 12. It seems like more of a land grab than a real solution for an overblown "problem." This is especially concerning when there are other routes / plans that can be considered which would not involve the immediate taking of some families' life long history and properties. Let's consider their "character" as part of the community we love.

The bottom line here is that I feel:

- 1) Things are being pushed along too rapidly and too soon.
- 2) Some projections, expectations and figures are being overstated.
- 3) This is an attempt to change the character of the FM 150 corridor to possibly benefit certain portions of the area residents; certainly not all.



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All, at the October 22 meeting, Joe Cantalupo made it clear that he believes there is an "issue" regarding the flow of traffic beginning at the intersection of FM 150 and Elder Hill Road and continuing along FM 150 to the intersection with FM 1826 (the "FM 150/Elder Hill Issue"). By including any extension of FM 1826 in the Phase I Study of FM 150, you are making a determination that the solution to the FM 150/Elder Hill Issue is an extension of FM 1826. There has not yet been sufficient studies or input to make this determination at this time. There are other possibilities to the FM 150/Elder Hill Issue and these need to be studied and explored. Input to the FM/Elder Hill Issue should be provided from the community. You should not include any extension of FM 1826 in the Phase I Study of FM 150.

Also, Joe Cantalupo, Commissioner Whisenant and Commissioner Conley have each told me no one has any idea where any extension of FM 1826 would be located, even if it were ever to be built, yet at the October 22 meeting, there were maps showing the location of the extension. Joe had previously told me that the presentation October 22 would not show a definite line, but would show a broad, wide area where an extension could possibly be located. Joe told me at the October 22 meeting that failing to make the change was an oversight on his part. Has this been corrected? If the extension of FM 1826 is included in the Phase I Study of FM 150 (which I believe is wrong for the reasons stated above), the location of any possible extension should be a broad, wide area showing the connection to RR 12 as being possible anywhere from Elder Hill Road to at least the point where the connection would be located if FM 1826 were extended directly, in a straight line, from the FM 150/FM 1826 intersection to RR 12.

I am a Driftwood resident on Elder Hill Road. I would like to add my comments for your consideration for the proposed changes for FM 150 to RR 12. These are in keeping with your group's frequently stated intention of "letting the character of community and environment define the location and design of the roadway". I have been on the Board of Directors for the local Urban Land Institute for many years which is a national land use educational group dedicated to "best practices" and not political advocacy of any kind.

1. CONNECCTION ROUTE BETWEEN FM 1826 and RR12:

Elder Hill Road shares the same characteristics as FM 150 in terms of "country beauty". Perhaps even more so because of it's low housing density along FM 170 from RR12 to FM 150 at the FM 1826 intersection. Most people moved out to this area for the "country setting" and not to simply convert the few scenic roadways that exist in the area to become "citified". Connecting FM 1826 on a relatively straight line to meet up with County Road 193 (Branson Road) does not ruin an already existing pleasant stretch of road.. It is also a more simple and logical solution.

Where a proposed connection point into Elder Hill Road is shown in the initial plan is at a particularly curvy and beautiful road area and all it accomplishes is cutting off a small corner versus going north a bit further to the existing County Road 193 to extend over to FM 1826. FM 170 would undoubtedly become a heavily trafficked speedway in very little time just to save a few minutes of drive time.

2. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES:

There is simply no practical way to avoid substantial environmental and habitat destruction along FM 170 that would come with widening and rebuilding an existing roadway, not to mention the significant traffic disruption that would occur versus an entirely new route as suggested above by many other people. We already have serious water resource issues that might even suggest "why is such a new road appropriate in this small area in the first place". Normally new roads are constructed to encourage more density and in spite of recent rains, we are still looking at the probability of a continued drought trend that will have to be contended with for a long time. My wife and I raise honeybees on our property that are so badly needed these days and they would surely disappear quickly with a new busy road nearby.

3. ECONOMIC ISSUES:

There is no doubt that acquisition of land would be dramatically more time consuming and expensive along the existing FM 170. With the current tax mood that exists it is incumbent upon all governmental entities to be extremely cognizant of maximum efficiency of limited public tax dollars available. Careful smart growth approaches to any new road can strike a better win-win from both an economic and scenic balance that I believe most people that already live in the area strongly prefer. This is not a growth versus no growth issue, but rather on of best balancing the Rubick's cube of challenges that any new road might create. That is accomplished by much more than any road engineer's input dominating the discussion.

4. THE GROWING WINERY AND MICROBREWERY BUSINESSES FOR TOURISM:

This specific area is seeing a substantial growth of these kinds of agrarian and tourist activities. One of the appeals of that kind of development is that folks spend their money with our costing government entities but minimal costs such as school construction, etc. These are some of the best "net positive tax revenues" that local governmental entities can ever hop for in the quest to squeeze required services costs form limited property and sales tax sources. One of the important components of that growth is to maintain the "country roadway" feel along a road like FM 170 and nearby rather than create a much faster speedway cut-off for commuters trying to get to a job in Austin. It is very much a symbiotic net tax revenue issue that combines a win – win for both economic AND environmental

Rob Baxter here. Unfortunately, my travels for work have prevented me from making these FM 150 meetings. However, now that I see the alternative maps I have to say there is a glaring omission that I am very curious about.

When looking at a skyview map of the region it becomes apparent that the more obvious choice (and far less intrusive into the heart of rural Driftwood) for this routing to connect Kyle to Dripping would be to improve Lone Man Mountain Road (CR183) from 3237 to RR12. It is far less distance of major improvements than the huge diagonal being planned from Hays City to Dripping. The distance from Hays City to RR12 along 3237 is far less than the diagonal route. RR12 has to improve anyway and is partially four lane already at the Elder Hill intersection. Also, RR12 becoming four lane to Winter's Mill from Dripping only makes sense and is inevitable....so why are we not making use of that improvement rather than tearing up FM150 from Hays City through Driftwood?

This more logical route is not in the considered plans...why not? Rather than opening up empty lands through Rutherford Ranch or destroying the stretch of 150 from 3237 to RR12, which is arguably one of the prettiest roads in the county, if not state. Traffic on 150 is simply not a major issue now or should be in the future, but it will be if either of these present plans (Rutherford Bypass or 150 Route) goes through. This is a crying shame, especially when there is a viable alternative that could better service the needs of Kyle, Dripping and Wimberley in one fell swoop and far better without disrupting the status quo on FM 150 through Driftwood.

Sadly, the website is woefully mis-named "ImproveFM150" when it proposes no such thing.

Please let us all know why CR183 is not being considered here.

I am writing to express my opposition to the four-laning of FM 150 between FM 1826 and RR 12. This stretch of 150 is quiet and residential with some small commercial activities. We do not need to risk turning it into an expressway from Dripping Springs to Austin.

Nature follows a path of least resistance. If 150 is widened from RR 12 to FM 1826, the opportunities to bypass 290 and possibly tolls in Oak Hill and to drive fast with more ability to pass slower traffic will encourage more traffic to detour from 290 to 1826. History suggests increased traffic will result in increased commercial growth, changing the character in an undesirable direction. The increase in commercial development will increase the amount of impermeable cover which will affect the drainage into Onion Creek, increasing the potential for flooding, as well as environmental contamination. Part of that increase in traffic will be more trucks zipping through into Austin rather than taking 290 into Oak Hill.

The rational for widening the road presented at the meeting I attended at the Driftwood Community Center (I was out of town Oct. 22) was to accommodate traffic to the new high school on Sawyer Ranch Road. Assuming that the school traffic uses the road an hour in the morning and an hour in the afternoon, five days a week, for nine months of the year, we would be widening that road for heavier usage occurring less than 5% of the time. That's a lot of tax money for little use. Looking at the intersection of 150 and Darden Hill, there appears to be plenty of undeveloped space to accommodate some turn lanes and other improvements to help with school-related congestion. Remember too that those anticipated trucks taking advantage of this wider road will be creating dangers for the students driving to school.

I commute from Driftwood to San Marcos. I have learned the backroads to avoid flooding, wrecks and other road closures. Many of these alternative routes are subject to flooding. Rather than put all our eggs in one basket with a few wider roadways to carry large amounts of traffic, we need to look at improving more 2-lane roads to share some of the load as well as to provide alternative routes during road closures. For instance, adding some passing opportunities on 12 between San Marcos and Wimberley. FM 150 is subject to flooding from Onion Creek - the more traffic using it, the bigger the disaster if and when it floods.

The Reeves/Reaves cemetery is on our property along with other historical reminders. FM 150 is the road through my quiet little neighborhood here on "the big curve." The proposal presents options (dashed lines) for increasing the radius of curvature on the big curve which will potentially displace some of my neighbors, and certainly impact all of us in the neighborhood with noise, wildlife disruption, and dust. This sharp curve occurs because the road is circling around a hill which would have to blasted off to accommodate a four lane highway. I have concerns that the dust and pollutants from the construction of these roads, as well as the increased traffic, will impact our ability to use our rainwater collection system for potable water. These options also dangerously limit the visibility for those of us who turn out onto FM 150 from Reaves Road. I am very opposed to these options to modify FM 150. These dashed lines on the map are also misleading since they are much narrower than the actual road would be.

I realize that traffic is going to increase in the area and we need to make smart decisions now, and that as the population grows, the value system of what is important to the majority of the citizenry will change, making our decisions now even more important to protect what we, the citizens who have been here awhile, value. But we don't need to create problems that don't have to exist. I would like to see the county think about adding more passing and turn lanes on existing roads and improving smaller roads to take on part of the load before jumping in and four-laning FM 150 from FM 1826 to RR 12.

I am writing to respectfully request that the extension of FM 1826 not be mentioned in Phase I of the FM 150 Character Plan, and that if reference is made to the extension of FM 1826 in Phase I, that it be downgraded to "one possib" ility among several" potential solutions to the "FM 150/Elder Hill Road issue" rather than a "recommendation".

I have written and submitte d a letter previously – before attending the Oct ober meeting at Thurman's Mansion.

Now, in light of the content shared during, and conversations had after, the presentation at that meeting, I am submitting a second letter coming from a different perspective than my first. I appreciate you considering both of my letters as valid input.

Key points extracted from the Hays County Transportation Plan (HCTP)

- Forecasted growth in Hays county will occur primarily along the I-35 corridor
- Growth in the rural areas of Hays County will be limited, by both commuting for employment, and by limitations to aquifer water supplies from private or community well systems. The real impact of aquifer water supplies limiting residential growth has not been adequately explored.
- Growth in rural areas of the county will occur along RR12 near Dripping Springs and FM 1826,
 i.e Rim Rock and north, where home buyers determine commuting distances to Austin are reasonable

Observations and opinions regarding the HCTP

- The largest growth in traffic will impact I-35 commuters traveling daily for employment in Austin, San Antonio, San Marcos and New Braunfels
- Secondarily, commuters will continue to use RR12/290 and FM1826 to access employment in Austin
- How and where population growth can occur in the county will be largely determined
 by the availability of water supplies. Until this subject is properly studied and factored
 into growth projections, all CAMPO growth projections are subject to serious
 question. If the growth projections, either in gross number or by location, are flawed
 then road planning will be flawed as well.
- Much less traffic growth will be imposed on FM 150, and even less on FM 170 (Elder Hill Road). Traffic growth on FM 150 will primarily be from FM 3237 to FM 1826 (tofrom Austin), not from 1826 to RR12 (Dripping Springs) (Concepts 2 and 9)
- Improvements to increase traffic capacity on RR12 and FM 1826 will be necessary. Perhaps not 4 lanes, but with addition of passing zones, either 4 lane or 3 lane. As a note, I have not seen the addition of passing zones identified as a potential improvement in any of the presentation/plan materials.
- The consultant's presentation on 22 October several times showed RR12 improvements as examples of what could be possible for FM 150. I travel RR12 from Wimberley to San Marcos weekly. There are very limited permitted passing sections on the current 2 lane road, and the normal on-coming traffic volume usually prevents any opportunity to pass slower traffic. It seems that passing zones, either 3 or 4 lanes, would go a long way to solving this problem. A perfect example of a 4 lane passing zone is RR 12 at FM 170.

- The unique character of FM 150 from Driftwood to FM 3237 should not be changed. No substantial changes to the double low water crossings. The number of times each year that the crossings are impassable due to high water flow is minimal and acceptable. (Concept 4)
- The alternative to construct a new FM 150 corridor from 3237 to FM 967 would be preferred. (Concept 7)
- Similarly, the unique character of FM 170 should not be changed. If higher capacity is really need in the future, a completely new route from FM 1826 to RR12 should be utilized. (Concept 9). Whether more capacity will be needed is very questionable in my mind.
- Better flow control of traffic at intersections; FM 1826 at FM 150, FM 150 at FM 3237 and FM 150 at RR12 would help alleviate backups. The current condition of a single stop sign with no control of through traffic is inadequate. (Concepts 1 and 5)

Conclusions and summary opinions

- RR 12 from San Marcos to Dripping Springs, and FM 1826 from Driftwood to HWY 290
 need immediate attention. The lack of passing on both roads results in regular stack up
 of traffic trying to drive the posted speed limit.
 With all the investment on RR 12 improvements from San Marcos to Wimberley over
 the past couple of years it may be a safer road, but none of the investment has
 increased capacity one bit.
- "Perhaps", FM 150 from FM 1826 to RR 12 will need improvement. Currently, in my driving experience, the traffic volume is far below the 2 lane road capacity. (Concept 2)
- Upgrading capacity on FM 150 from FM 1826 to FM 3237, and upgrading capacity on FM
 170 will largely act to attract more traffic build it and they will come

Immediate rehabilitative road work is required

- FM 170 (Elder Hill Rd) from La Ventana's entrance, east to FM 150 needs to be repaved, shoulders cleared of vegetation, and centerline restriped. Damaged shoulders, minimum as they are, need to be reestablished to avoid pavement breakage, and lane limit striping added.
- Better signage on FM 150, indicating the intersection with FM 170 would be helpful
- Trimming of vegetation on the shoulders of FM 170 from RR 12 to La Ventana entrance

Thank you for your deliberate, comprehensive and early consideration of the expansion of FM150. Our family's property in Driftwood means more to us than we could convey in any forum. It is incumbent upon us to voice our strong opposition to one particular aspect of the FM150 expansion presentation.

It should be considered that the "Potential Bypass Route" which extends 1826 to RR12 by stealing mileage from Elder Hill Road would do nothing to accomplish the goals of this important project. Elder Hill Road is narrow, prone to flooding and curves drastically. Elder Hill Road can never sustain the kind of traffic this project hopes to accommodate (either in lane width or number of travelers). La Ventana and other multi-family and rental development sites on this road have pushed Elder Hill Road far enough. The disruption of both farms and families along this route to increase capacity and make the connection from 1826 to RR12 would be devastating not only to my own family and our treasured home, but to the dozens of us who have shared this space for decades.

This bypass route additionally fails to utilize the space that currently exists along FM150 for expansion. There are characteristics along much of FM150 which no doubt account for the County's decision to identify FM150 for expansion in the first place. It should not be bypassed at the great expense of Elder Hill Road and to the waste of FM150's own untapped potential. The "community zone" that you have rightly identified as such around Elder Hill Road doesn't stop at the intersection with FM150. It extends all the way to the Driftwood Winery. Elder Hill Road contributes mightily to the heart of this community.

It should lastly be added that this bypass route will unleash travelers on a flood-prone portion of RR12 that is undergoing unprecedented growth of its own and remains a two lane road all the way to Dripping Springs. Relocating a bottleneck from 1826/FM 150 to this portion of RR12 will not achieve this project's goals. Lights at 1826/FM150 and/or at FM150/Elder Hill Road are improvements—the bypass route is a tremendous waste. As someone who knows first hand from three clerkships with the Texas Attorney General's transportation division, the number and severity of takings that would have to happen would expend more time, resources and community sentiment than could possibly be budgeted for this project. The funds that are ultimately approved for this improvement should be put towards building a safe and appropriate expansion of FM150.

- Wait until a 4 lane road from Dripping Springs to 150 is constructed (on RM12). It would serve no purpose to have 4 lanes on 150 if there are not 4 lanes to Dripping Springs (meaning the corner of 12 and 290). Earn interest on your money while you wait for the 4 lanes on RM 12 to be constructed.



1. Attended presentation of Character Plan of 22 October 2015 given at Thurman Mansion.

At the end of that meeting, it was stated that all the comments given by members of the community in attendance would be shared on "improvefm150" website. And that comments submitted via email, such as mine, would also be available for interested parties to read. I have not been able to locate the page which contains those comments on the website. I would like to read all comments made by members of the community.

Comments:

- A. During the presentation, the main premise for wanting to make changes to FM 150 was that some entity determined that a four-lane corridor was required to hand vehicular traffic at some undefined date. It seems fuzzy logic was employed to create a requirement for four-lane traffic and some fuzzy date based an unverified population growth profile. Ever since 2000, Texas politicians have cited various population-growth profiles in attempts to plan for the future. I agree that planning for the future is a wise activity for government. However, about every two years the growth numbers change considerably from the previous set of numbers. Sometimes the growth rate is greater and other times it is less. The cost of implementing the character plan will be very expensive and should be based on more reliable data and forecasts.
- B. There are numerous transportation studies that have been conducted in the United States and around the world that show the sort of planning proposed does not solve transportation traffic congestion but increases it at a faster rate than would have occurred had the improvement not been made.
- C. The cost of this infrastructure fantasy will have to be borne by the existing tax payers who are already satisfied with the current road structure. Otherwise they would not have moved and built their homes here. The people who will benefit will arrive one to twenty years after the plan has been implemented and will not pay anything. There are numerous studies that have verified the validity of this tax argument. The only ones that ignore the studies are politicians and land developers.
- D. The character plan suggests, instead of a four-lane road along present day FM150 between intersection of FM1826/FM150 and intersection of FM150/FM3237, that FM 150 remain a two-lane road and an additional parallel route be created from FM 967 to FM 150 east of its intersection with FM3237. Two two-lane roads will not carry the same traffic load as a single four-lane road. The traffic problem is further acerbated by the fact that the newly created road will open up a vast interior of land for housing development and thus more vehicular traffic. Numerous comments have already been made to keep this segment of FM 150 as rural as possible to retain its unique hill country flavor. With the exception of some minor work to the double crossing of Onion Creek, FM 150 should be left as is. Any new parallel bypass road should be a four-lane parkway road to handle the proposed increased traffic load.
- E. It should become the policy of Hays County that the junction of two or more roads be controlled using roundabouts instead of stop signs or stoplights. Anyone who has driven for any length of time in Britain will know that roundabouts are a far more efficient means of handling traffic at road junctions, and they are cheaper and safer. They have no power outages or other electrical problems common to stop-light systems.

Bob Shannon

(1) Proposed route north of Onion Creek through Rutherford Ranch connecting with FM 967.

This is an excellent solution to preserve the integrity and character of the Driftwood community.

(2) Extension of 1826 west to 12.

Elder Hill Road is a country lane. Up until 20 years ago, one could drive from Driftwood turn without even meeting another car. Twenty years or so ago the Wimberley commuters "discovered" Elder Hill Road, and now use it as a short cut to drive to Austin. Now it is jammed in early mornings and late afternoons. The extension of 1826 to 12, as now proposed, works a great hardship on many Driftwood residents who live on small acreages. I believe that the proposed route north of Onion Creek connecting with 967 would draw off from Elder Hill Road a large part of the Wimberley traffic. From 967, the Wimberley traffic would then flow onto the extended 45 and on to Austin. This development would largely obviate the need for an extension of 1826 to 12.

(3) Miscellaneous comments

- (a) There needs to be an improvement of the connection of Darden Hill Road with 150.
- (b) There needs to be some character of traffic control on the intersection of 1826 and 150.
- (c) Before the steep hill on 150 dropping down to the first (or eastern?) crossing of Onion Creek there needs to be a warning to motorists that a steep hill is just around the corner. Please accept this email in lieu of a comment card regarding the concept plan presented at the public meeting on October 22, 2015.

In short, I applaud the concept plan as it preserves historic Driftwood from being burdened by a four lane pass-through thoroughfare. In addition, the views from the Onion Creek crossings and surrounding ranchland are preserved, which is an absolute necessity given this area is the most diverse and attractive topography and ranchland in Hays County.

As County population growth increases the demand for travel from Kyle and IH-35 to Dripping Springs, the proposed bypass from 3237 to 1826 (features 7 and 8) through the Rutherford Ranch if property designed and constructed should provide a less time-consuming route as opposed to concentrating that traffic on existing FM 150 from its intersection with 3237 west to Driftwood, which by its features (both curvy and with hills) limits the speed for safe travel. (Notwithstanding the proposed bypass, I endorse the proposed improvements to the low water crossings - as the roadway heading west down 150 to the first of the Onion Creek crossings as currently constructed is dangerous. The accident statistics presented at the first meeting bear this out.)

I have every expectation that with the passage of time, the Driftwood community will experience growth, both residential and commercial. If managed properly so as to retain its rustic hill country beauty the area will continue to flourish (as has already been proven by the Salt Lick, the vineyards and winery and Mandola's Trattoria Lisina) as a Central Texas destination location, given its proximity to existing population centers, namely Austin and San Marcos. But its attraction lies in its rural beauty—framed by beautiful ranches and diverse topography, accentuated with views of Onion Creek.

It would be a shame to diminish these public assets by replacing a meandering two lane FM 150 - wonderful for a Sunday head-clearing drive - with an improved higher-speed four lane thoroughfare of traffic from Kyle to Dripping Springs.

They still live on this property, as does my brother and his wife, who have built an extraordinary home on this property — what they like to refer to as their "dream home." While neither my sister nor I currently live on this property, we have always fully intended to move back when life circumstances allow, and certainly to spen dour retirement years there. We intend now, and have always intended, to keep this property in our family for generations to come.

My family chose Driftwood because it is a unique community, with an unparalleled character that allows for both peace and community involvement. We are all deeply concerned that the road expansions that are curr ently being discussed as possib ilities will dramatically change this charact er, and therefo re, will certainly i mpact the fam ilies who have cho sen this as **Home**.

We do understand Hays County is growing and we truly appreciate you accepting comments and input on the proposed expansion plans.

I have read and strongly agree with the "logical" reasons for objecting to any extension of FM 1826, and I will share those later in my letter. However, my loudest objections to the proposed expansion are from my heart:

- This is my family's home. We have built our foundation here. This is where we laugh together, pl ay together, cook and give than ks togeth er. This is where we celeb rate Christmas and Easter and family birthdays. The proposed expansi on would in many ways take this away from us all: no more privacy, no more safety, no more peaceful, walkable mornings or evenings. I cannot imaging retiring to a "country home" with a "multi-lane roadway" less than 100 yards away. It is not my dream, nor would it be something I would want to look forward to in my "gol den years." It would chang e everything.
- We have all ways intended this property would be in our family for generations to come. Our children have always known "this would somebody be theirs." We have intended this to be a gift of peace and solitude, beauty and nature. This gift would be rendered useless in my eyes if the discussed expansion of 1826 were to come into existence.
- We have been good stewards to our land, and have truly taken care of the land God has

Therefore spend the money where the growth is.
- Planning larger roads than are needed will surely attract growth to the area that otherwise would not come.

- The environmental impacts this kind of intrusion would have on local wildlife population and habit at is uni maginable. The danger to local wildlife is just the beginning. Infringement on habitat would be extensive. This is simply not consistent with the values and beliefs of this community.

Please be clear: We respectfully object to any expansion of FM 1826. My family and I commend you for seeking and accepting community input on these issues. It is disconcerting and a bit alarming that 2 important meetings for those of us concerned about protecting Driftwood have been scheduled simultaneously as that makes participation & representation at both get togethers impossible. Please make sure this is noted at the meeting tomorrow night at Thurman's place.

The incredibly beautiful unique Driftwood area has been my home (and homestead) for over 20 years. It is essential that it be protected for native wildlife and future generations of people. Road expansion of 150 would destroy countless gorgeous old trees in addition to a huge amount of the natural habitat and the many species that depend on this special environment. Golden cheek warbler habitat is on the slope above Onion Creek bridge, which means that endangered species are potentially threatened if road expansion occurs in this vicinity. The direct proximity of some sections of FM 150 to Onion Creek (and the other low water creek crossings) would make for additional costly and complicated construction; an expanded FM 150 is at high risk of extensive damage during heavy rains and could jeopardize human lives during major flooding (and add to long term repair & maintenance expenses). I hope that serious consideration of alternative plans continues and that preservation of this extraordinary region is a priority.

Our family owns approximately 110 acres just west and south of the intersection of FM My Mother and Step-Father have lived on the property for almost 40 years. We have now moved to the property and built our "Dream Home". We all plan on living on the property until the end. I also expect my two sisters and their families to return to live on the property again at some point. We are concerned that the contemplated road expansions may drastically change the character of the area and the lives of the people who live in the area. We strongly oppose any extension of FM 1826. We feel any road improvements should be done to existing roads or in areas where the property owners are in agreement to build the improvements. We understand Hays County is growing and we commend you for accepting comments on these issues. Although you may not agree with or like some of our comments, they are submitted with the utmost respect for you and the job you are charged with. We will provide COMMENTS SPECIFIC TO OUR PROPERTY AND LIVES and GENERAL COMMENTS below.

COMMENTS SPECIFIC TO OUR PROPERTY AND LIVES

As you already know, our family has been here for many years. We have built substantial improvements on our property and have worked to make our property a "special place". It is not reasonable or prudent for Hays County to attempt to take and pay for our property and/or improvements to enable an extension of FM 1826. We will not voluntarily sell our property to Hays County.

n our property where William Marshall Perry (1800-1883), and his daughter, Elizabeth Tyson (1820-1883), are buried. Perry fought with Houston at Gonzales and San Jacinto. He fought in many battles with Indians and was a Texas Ranger who served under Captain Samuel Highsmith and Captain H.E.

McCulloch. He lived his last few years on our property in a house that still exists. One of Perry's sons was Cicero Rufas Perry, a legendary soldier, Indian fighter, scout and Captain in the Texas Rangers. Attached as Exhibit "A" to this letter is information regarding the lives of the Perry Family and their contribution to the history of the State of Texas.

There is a cave system located through our property. It is our understanding this cave system goes from at least the Browning Ranch through our property and all the way to Onion Creek. The stories include accounts of local residents who would start a fire at one end of the cave system and go to Onion Creek to watch the smoke come out of the cave. In the 1970's, we had people want to come explore the caves, but we eventually disallowed visitors.

Our family has worked hard to live the life we live in Driftwood. As we have told some of you, we feel we are "Living the Dream". We wake up every day thinking "We won". We have neighbors who feel the same way. Some tell us they are selling their property because of the proposed extension of FM 1826. That is not right. People should not have their lives and dreams destroyed by new roadways that are unnecessary and unwanted.

We went through extensive planning with regard to many issues before building our "Dream Home". Never in our wildest dreams did we anticipate a new road being located through our property near our home. The worst we ever imagined was that a widening of Elder Hill Road may move our property line to the north and take our gate, which can be replaced.

If there is an extension of FM 1826 such that our home may be seen from the new road, we will not feel that our lives or property are safe.

Our property and improvements are awesome, a "little piece of Heaven". We should not have to spend time and expense at our age to hire lawyers and fight something like this, but we will if we have to.

Hays County should not want to send the message that if you come to Hays County and live the "American Dream" (borrowed from Will Conley) and build your "Dream Home", a new road may be built over you to accommodate others in the County.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Funds designated for road improvements should be spent in the higher growth areas. While we understand it is likely Hays County will experience significant growth in the coming years, we feel that the growth in the Driftwood area will not be nearly as significant as the growth in the San Marcos, Kyle, Buda and Dripping Springs areas. For many reasons, Driftwood will likely never see the growth of rooftops as will be seen in the San Marcos, Kyle, Buda and Dripping Springs areas. The money should be spent in these areas, not Driftwood.

Four lane roadways are not appropriate for the Driftwood area. Driftwood is a charming rural area abundant with historical significance, wineries and gorgeous ranches. Two lane roads with turn lanes and other features are more appropriate for this area.

"If you build it they will come." Building any extension of FM 1826 will only promote the building of residential rooftops and commercial development that otherwise would not occur. This is not the vision of the current Driftwood area residents. Driftwood area residents are here because they do not want the noise, traffic or neighborhood issues associated with such development.

Driftwood area residents should not be made to sacrifice by having an extension of FM 1826 built through some of the prime Driftwood area properties for the benefit of other areas of Hays County. If people want to get from one side of the county to the other, they should be made to use existing roadways with appropriate improvements. Our area should not be responsible for providing transportation routes primarily benefitting others.

The Transportation Plan should be changed. If the existing Transportation Plan for Hays County shows an extension of FM 1826, there should be further study done to obtain community input and evaluate whether it will be needed and what alternatives are available.

The only reason there is not more voiced opposition to the potential extension of FM 1826 is because many people are not aware of the potential plan. We have not heard any comments in favor of the FM 1826 extension. Not one.

We are aware of reports questioning the assumptions and data used by Hays County to project transportation needs. We are no experts regarding the collection of this data, but surely Hays County will only plan and build road improvements based on correct assumptions and data that confirms with certainty the need for such improvements.

Any road improvements will clearly have an impact on the local environment. This is a pristine, natural area full of wildlife. Any improvements should be done in a manner to limit damage to the local environment and wildlife habitat.

Any plans for the extension of FM 1826 need more time to be evaluated and reappraised. Studies show that area roadways are nowhere near their capacities at this time, so we need to take the appropriate amount of time to plan this and get it right.

The Driftwood economy is made up of wineries, tourism, ranching, wedding venues, etc. These operations exist here because this is a beautiful, unspoiled, historically significant piece of the world. Although roadway improvements would better enable people to access these operations, they would also alter the very reason these operations are here, which could destroy the livelihood of the people who own these operations. Building roadways in new areas will only change the character of the land and properties in this area, a change that likely can not be

reversed.

In summary, Driftwood is a wonderful, unique area full of history, beautiful ranches and laid back residents who love being here. Any proposed road improvements should accommodate area residents and be done in a manner to cause the least destruction possible to the lives they have built. This can be done by improving existing roadways, not building new roadways such as an extension of FM 1826. As one lady said at a recent CAP Meeting when discussing any potential harm that may occur to the Driftwood Store, the Driftwood Post Office and other structures at the FM 150/Elder Hill Road intersection due to the proposed roadway improvements, "If you build the 1826 extension, you won't have to worry about the store, the post office or anything else Driftwood because there will no longer be a Driftwood. Driftwood is the people, the properties and the character of the area and that will be destroyed." We could not agree more.

My wife and I lived there for three years. We moved there to get away from the rat-race of Austin, to enjoy the peace and quiet of country living, and considered it a blessing to have a place like Driftwood in which to move. And, we have always planned on retiring there for the same reasons.

During our time in Aus tin and Driftwood, we worked hard on the is land... planting trees, building and tending to a garden, seeding grass, dealing with weeds, raising cattle, trimming cedars... the list goes on.

You don't put that kind of sweat and tears into a piec e of land that you don't expect to have a really long time.

I am writing to respectfully express my opposition to any extension of FM 1826. Our family owns about 110 acres just west and south of the inters ection of FM and FM. This property has been a part of our family for almost 40 years, when my mother and step-father established our family home there. They still live on this property, as does my brother and his wife, who have built an extraordinary home on this property — what they like to refer to as their "dream home." While neither my sister nor I currently live on this property, we have always fully intended to move back when life circumstances allow, and certainly to spend our retirement years there. We intend now, and have always intended, to keep this property in our family for generations to come.

My family chose Driftwood because it is a unique community, with an unparalleled character that allows for both peace and community involvement. We are all deeply concerned that the road expansions that are curr ently being discussed as possib ilities will dramatically change this charact er, and therefo re, will certainly i mpact the fam ilies who have cho sen this as **Home**.

We do understand Hays County is growing and we truly appreciate you accepting comments and input on the proposed expansion plans.

I have read and strongly agree with the "logical" reasons for objecting to any extension of FM 1826, and I will share those later in my letter. However, my loudest objections to the proposed expansion are from my heart:

- This is my family's home. We have built our foundation here. This is where we laugh together, pl ay together, cook and give than ks togeth er. This is where we celeb rate Christmas and Easter and family birthdays. The proposed expansi on would in many ways take this away from us all: no more privacy, no more safety, no more peaceful, walkable mornings or evenings. I cannot imaging retiring to a "country home" with a "multi-lane roadway" less than 100 yards away. It is not my dream, nor would it be something I would want to look forward to in my "gol den years." It would chang e everything.
- We have all ways intended this property would be in our family for generations to come. Our children have always known "this would somebody be theirs." We have intended this to be a gift of peace and solitude, beauty and nature. This gift would be rendered useless in my eyes if the discussed expansion of 1826 were to come into existence.
- We have been good stewards to our land, and have truly taken care of the land God has

blessed us with. We have nurtured it and the inhabitants of it. We have learned how to take care of it and be mindful of the cycle of life that takes place on it. There is evidence all over our property t hat animals are well come here. Proposed expansion would take away all of that. The animals that did survive dodging t raffic would no longer have a peaceful habitat in which to live. Fewer and fewer wildlife would choose this as home, and in turn, the lands cape become barren. This is not at all what I want for this community.

As for the logical arguments, I recap them here:

- County funds need to be allocated to high priority road projects, especially in those areas that are the most rapidly growing. While we certainly understand that Driftwood faces growth, the projections for this area are not near what San Marcos, Kyle, Buda and Dripping Springs are expecting. Therefore spend the money where the growth is.
- Planning larger roads than are needed will surely attract growth to the area that otherwise would not come.
- Having a four-lane "h ighway" serve as the extension of any of our local roads i s completely out of character for this community. Look around there is nothing that is consistent with road construction of this magnitude.
- The environmental impacts this kind of intrusion would have on local wildlife population and habit at is uni maginable. The danger to local wildlife is just the beginning. Infringement on habitat would be extensive. This is simply not consistent with the values and beliefs of this community.

Please be clear: We respectfully object to any expansion of FM 1826. My family and I commend you for seeking and accepting community input on these issues. I, frankly, would not want to be in your shoes. I appreciate that you are, and that you are willing to listen to your constituents on decisions of this magnitude.
